<u>POLITICAL REFORM ACT</u>: Pursuant to Government Code Sections 56700.1 and 81000 et seq., any person or combination of persons who directly or indirectly contributes \$1,000 or more or expends \$1,000 or more in support of or in opposition to a change of organization or reorganization that will be, or has been, submitted to LAFCO must comply, to the same extent as provided for local initiative measures, with reporting and disclosure requirements of the California Political Reform Act of 1974. Additional information can be obtained by contacting the Fair Political Practices Commission. Pursuant to Government Code Section 84308, if you wish to participate in the proceedings indicated on this Agenda, you or your agent is prohibited from making a campaign contribution of \$250 or more to any Commissioner or Alternate Commissioner. This prohibition begins on the date you begin to actively support or oppose an application before LAFCO and continues until 12 months after a final decision is rendered by LAFCO. If you or your agent has made a contribution of \$250 or more to any Commissioner must disqualify themselves from the decision in the proceeding. However, disqualification is not required if the Commissioner or Alternate Commissioner must disqualify themselves from the decision in the proceeding. However, disqualification is not required if the Commissioner or Alternate Commissioner returns that campaign contribution within 30 days of learning both about the contribution and the fact that you are a participant in the proceedings.

6. ACTION ITEMS

a) Proposed Devlin Road No. 6 Annexation to the Napa Sanitation District and Associated CEQA Findings

The Commission considered a proposal for the annexation of one parcel totaling 27.55 acres in size to the Napa Sanitation District. The affected territory is identified as Assessor Parcel Number 057-170-024. SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

This is a consent item for formal action. Accordingly, if interested, the Commission is invited to pull this item for additional discussion with the concurrence of the Chair.

It is recommended the Commission adopt the Resolution of the Local Agency Formation Commission of Napa County Amending its Conflict of Interest Code (COIC), included as Attachment 1.

As a local public agency, LAFCO must have a COIC that sets forth the obligations of staff and Commissioners to disclose their financial interests. Every two years, all public agencies must review their COICs and notify their code reviewing body of any changes needed to their adopted COIC. Because LAFCO's jurisdiction is limited to Napa County, the County of Napa is the code reviewing body for LAFCO, meaning the County must approve LAFCO's COIC and any amendments.

Staff proposes an amendment to the COIC that would make a handful of relatively minor revisions as shown with tracked changes in Attachment 2. The most significant recommended revision is to add two staff positions to the list of designated employee positions subject to Form 700 financial interest disclosure requirements.

If the Commission adopts the draft resolution, staff will then provide the amended COIC to the County for approval.

RESOLUTION OF THE LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION OF NAPA COUNTY AMENDING ITS CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

WHEREAS, the Political Reform Act of 1974 (Government Code Sections 81000, et seq., hereinafter the "PRA") requires the Local Agency Formation Commission of Napa County (hereinafter LAFCO) to adopt a Conflict of Interest Code; and

WHEREAS, the Fair Political Practices Commission (hereinafter referred to as "FPPC") has adopted a regulation (Section 18730 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations) containing a standard conflict of interest code which may be incorporated by reference into the code of a local agency; and

WHEREAS, LAFCO is required to review and amend its Conflict of Interest Code biennially to determine if amendments are needed; and

WHEREAS, an amendment to the Conflict of Interest Code is necessary to update the list of designated filers; and

WHEREAS, LAFCO staff has provided notice of the proposed amendment to its adopted Conflict of Interest Code to the County of Napa, as the code reviewing body for LAFCO; and

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting of LAFCO, held on October 7, 2024, oral and/or written comments on the proposed amendment to the Conflict of Interest Code were received from affected persons and or the general public, and these comments and the proposed revisions were considered by LAFCO;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by LAFCO that the Conflict of Interest Code shall be amended and adopted in the manner set forth in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, effective upon confirmation by the Napa County Board of Supervisors acting as the code reviewing body for LAFCO.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by LAFCO that the Clerk is hereby directed to certify as to the adoption of this resolution and forward the Conflict of Interest Code as set forth in Exhibit "A" to the County of Napa for its review.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by LAFCO that the adoption of this resolution and the amendment of LAFCO's Conflict of Interest Code is not a project for purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (hereinafter CEQA) pursuant to section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines, as there is no possibility that this activity may have a significant effect on the environment, and section 15378(b)(2) of the CEQA Guidelines, as an administrative and personnel-related policymaking activity.

LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION OF NAPA COUNTY

Conflict of Interest Code

(Adopted: January 9, 2003; Last Amended: October 3, 2016; Proposed Amendment: October 7, 2024)

1. <u>Purpose.</u> The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 California Code of Regulations, Section 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing, the standard code may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act (the "Act"). Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth fully herein.

2. <u>List of Designated Employees.</u> For the purposes of the Act and this Conflict of Interest Code, the Designated Employees of LAFCO shall be the persons holding those offices and performing the functions of the positions set forth in Appendix "A," attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein.

3. <u>List of Disclosure Categories</u>. For purposes of the requirements of the Act and the provisions of this code, the disclosure categories for the Designated Employees of LAFCO shall be those set forth in Appendix "B," attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein.

4. <u>Documents Comprising Conflict of Interest Code.</u> For purposes of the Act, the terms of Section 18730 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations, as may be amended from time to time, and Appendices "A" and "B" shall together constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of LAFCO on and after the date of confirmation by the Napa County Board of Supervisors.

5. <u>Effective Date of Code.</u> This Conflict of Interest Code shall become effective when confirmed by the Napa County Board of Supervisors acting as the code reviewing body for LAFCO.

6. <u>Documents to be filed with the Board of Supervisors</u>. As the "Filing Officer" under this Code, the LAFCO Secretary shall file three certified copies of the Conflict of Interest Code, as approved/amended by the LAFCO Commission, with the Napa County Board of Supervisors as the code reviewing body for LAFCO.

7. <u>Time of Filing Statements of Economic Interests.</u> All persons who are required by this Conflict of Interest Code to file Statements of Economic Interests ("Statements" or "Form 700s"), shall file assuming office, leaving office, and annual Statements as required by Section 18730 of Title 2 of California Code of Regulations.

8. <u>Place of Filing.</u> Designated employees shall file their Statements of Economic Interests with the LAFCO Secretary, who shall retain the original Statements in the LAFCO business office.

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9. <u>Public Inspection of Conflict of Interest Code and Statements</u>. A copy of the Conflict of Interest Code and all filed Statements shall be maintained in the office of LAFCO and be available for public inspection and copying during regular business hours.

10. <u>LAFCO Review of Adopted Code.</u>

A. No later than October 1 of each even-numbered year, LAFCO shall submit to the Napa County Board of Supervisors, as the code reviewing body for LAFCO, a written statement signed by the LAFCO Executive Officer, or designee thereof, that either:

1. LAFCO has reviewed the Conflict of Interest Code, that the Conflict of Interest Code designates accurately all positions which make or participate in the making of governmental decisions for LAFCO, that the disclosure assigned those positions accurately require the disclosure of all investments, business positions, interests in real property, and sources of income which may foreseeably be affected materially by the decisions made by those designated positions, and that the Conflict of Interest Code contains the provisions required by Government Code section 87302; or

2. LAFCO has reviewed the Conflict of Interest Code and has determined that amendment is necessary to designate all positions which make or participate in the making of governmental decisions for LAFCO, or to update the disclosure categories assigned to require the disclosure of all investments, business positions, interests in real property and sources of income which may be affected materially by the designated positions, or to include other provisions required by Government Code section 87302. If the statement contains this report, LAFCO shall submit the amendment to the Napa County Board of Supervisors within 90 days of the report.

B. Changed circumstances which require amendment of the Conflict of Interest Code shall include, but not be limited to:

1. The creation of positions which involve the making or participation in the making of decisions which may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest;

2. The reclassification, renaming, or deletion of previously designated positions;

3. The addition, deletion, or modification of statutorily-required provisions of this Conflict of Interest Code; or

4. The addition, deletion, or modification of the specific types of investments, business positions, interests in real property, and sources of income which are reportable unless such changes have been automatically incorporated into this Conflict of Interest Code as the result of inclusion of amendments made to Section 18730 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations by the Fair Political Practices Commission.

This determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection and be available for inspection and copying in the same location and manner as LAFCO's copy of the Conflict of Interest Code.

-(Adopted:- January 9, 2003; Last Amended: -October 3, 2016<u>; Proposed Amendment: October 7, 2024</u>)

1. <u>Purpose.</u> The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 California Code of Regulations, Section 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing, the standard code may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act (the "Act"). Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth fully herein.

2. <u>List of Designated Employees.</u> For the purposes of the Act and this Conflict of Interest Code, the Designated Employees of LAFCO shall be the persons holding those offices and performing the functions of the positions set forth in Appendix "A," attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein.



This report summarizes all current and future boundary change proposals. There is currently one active proposal on file and eight anticipated new proposals that are expected to be submitted in the future. A summary follows.

Active Proposals

Lynn Drive Annexation to NSD

A representative for the landowner of 25 Lynn Drive in the City of Napa submitted an application to annex the parcel to the Napa Sanitation District (NSD). The parcel is within NSD's sphere of influence (SOI), identified as Assessor Parcel Number (APN) 041-560-001, and is approximately 1.67 acres in size. The purpose of the proposal is to allow the one existing residence within the parcel and one additional future residence to connect to NSD's public sewer infrastructure. The proposal is on today's agenda as item 6a.



Anticipated Proposals

Paoli Loop/Watson Lane Annexation to the City of American Canyon


A landowner submitted a preliminary application to annex 16 parcels and a portion of railroad totaling approximately 83 acres of territory to the American Canyon. Concurrent Citv of detachment from County Service Area No. 4 is required under local policy. The area is located within the City's SOI near Watson Lane and Paoli Loop and identified as APNs 057-120-014, -015, -017, -028, -034, -036, -041, -045, -047, -048, -049, -050, & -051, 057-180-014 & -015, and 059-020-036. The purpose of annexation is to allow development of the area for industrial and residential purposes as well as help facilitate the extension of Newell Drive to South Kelly Road. The City of American Canyon, as lead agency under CEQA, certified a Final Environmental Impact Report for the Paoli/Watson Lane Annexation Project. It is anticipated a complete



application for annexation will be submitted in the foreseeable future.

Big Ranch Road/Rosewood Lane Annexation to the City of Napa

The City of Napa is processing an application from multiple landowners for the annexation of five entire parcels and a portion of a sixth parcel totaling approximately 53.5 acres. The parcels are located within the City's SOI at 2275 Big Ranch Road, 2285 Big Ranch Road, 2305 Big Ranch Road, 1130 Trower Avenue (portion), and 1438 Rosewood Lane, and identified as APNs 038-240-022, 038-240-005, 038-240-023, 038-240-014, and 038-160-029, respectively. Annexation to the City would allow the parcels to be developed consistent with the City's adopted Big Ranch Road Specific Plan and a future master plan for the area. Notably, the current configuration of the planned annexation would result in the creation of new unincorporated islands, which is prohibited under state law unless LAFCO makes a specific finding related to the orderly




development of the City. It is anticipated an application for annexation will be submitted to LAFCO in the foreseeable future.


Linda Vista No. 22 Annexation to NSD

A representative for the landowner of one unincorporated parcel submitted a preliminary application to annex one parcel to NSD. The parcel is in NSD's SOI, identified as APN 007-231-006, located at 3750 Linda Vista Avenue, and is approximately 1.2 acres in size. Annexation to NSD would facilitate an SB9 urban lot split, dividing the one parcel into five and connecting all existing and future structures to NSD. The application is pending analysis of potential environmental impacts.



Old Sonoma Road/Buhman Avenue Annexation to CVWD


A landowner previously submitted a proposal to annex three unincorporated parcels totaling approximately 141.5 acres in size to the Congress Valley Water District (CVWD). The parcels are located in CVWD's SOI along the northwestern side of Old Sonoma Road at its intersection with Buhman Avenue and identified as APNs 047-030-005, 047-030-020, and 047-080-001. Current land uses include two singlefamily residences and commercial vineyards with auxiliary structures and facilities. Two of the parcels already receive water service through grandfathered outside service agreements. Annexation would establish permanent water service to all three parcels. CVWD has requested, and the landowners have agreed, to postpone LAFCO action. There is no current timetable for the process to be resumed.

NCRCD Donut Hole Annexation


Staff from the Napa County Resource Conservation District (NCRCD) has inquired about annexation of approximately 1.300 acres of incorporated territory located in the City of Napa. This area comprises the only remaining territory located within NCRCD's SOI but outside its jurisdictional boundary and is commonly referred to as a "donut hole". The purpose of annexation would be to allow NCRCD to expand its service programs and hold public meetings within the affected territory; activities that are currently prohibited within the area. In February 2020, the Commission approved a request for a waiver of LAFCO's proposal processing fees. The Commission recently completed a Municipal Service Review for NCRCD that includes a



recommendation for the District to annex the donut hole. It is anticipated a proposal for annexation will be submitted in the future, but there is no current timetable.

7140 & 7150 Berryessa-Knoxville Road Annexation to SFWD

A landowner has inquired about annexation of one entire unincorporated parcel and a portion of a second unincorporated parcel totaling approximately 7.9 acres in size to the Spanish Flat Water District (SFWD). The parcels were added to SFWD's SOI in 2021, are located at 7140 and 7150 Berryessa-Knoxville Road, and identified as APNs 019-280-004 (entire) and 019-280-006 (portion). Current land uses within the parcels include a commercial boat and recreational vehicle storage facility (Lakeview Boat Storage), approximately 6,000 square feet of enclosed storage structures, an administrative office, and a detached single-family residence. The parcels are currently dependent on private water and septic systems to support existing Annexation would facilitate the uses. connection of existing uses to SFWD's water and sewer services. It is anticipated a proposal




for annexation will be submitted in the future, but there is no current timetable.


Materials Diversion Facility Annexation to the City of Napa

Staff from the City of Napa has inquired about annexation of approximately 2.9 acres of unincorporated territory comprising a portion of a parcel owned by the Napa-Vallejo Waste Management Authority. The APN of the entire parcel is 057-090-060. A property sale and a lot line adjustment are planned to create new parcels. The purpose of the property acquisition and future annexation is to expand the City's existing materials diversion facility operations. The property is located outside the City of Napa's SOI near the City of American Canyon. Annexation to the City of Napa is allowed given the property is owned by the City and soon will be used by the City for municipal purposes.¹ It is anticipated a proposal for annexation will be submitted in the future, but there is no current timetable.



Wastewater Treatment Plant Annexation to NBRID

Staff from the Napa Berryessa Resort Improvement District (NBRID) has inquired about annexation of two unincorporated parcels totaling approximately 101 acres in size that serve as the location of the District's wastewater treatment plant facilities. The parcels were added to NBRID's SOI in 2021, are owned by NBRID, and are identified as APNs 019-220-028 & -038. Annexation would be for purposes of reducing NBRID's annual property tax burden. It is anticipated a proposal for annexation will be submitted in the future, but there is no current timetable.

BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY

This is a consent item for information purposes only. Accordingly, if interested, the Commission is invited to pull this item for additional discussion with the concurrence of the Chair. No formal action will be taken as part of this item.

On April 8, 2024, the Commission directed staff to submit letters to the Legislature supporting Assembly Bill (AB) 817 (*open meetings: teleconferencing*) and Senate Bill (SB) 1209 (*indemnification*). The Commission also discussed AB 3277 (*districts: property tax*) and agreed to watch the bill.

Staff previously submitted letters in support of AB 817 and SB 1209 to the Legislature, and those letters were included as part of Legislative Reports on past meeting agendas. In addition, staff recently submitted a letter requesting the Governor sign SB 1209, included as Attachment 1.

AB 3277 was signed into law on July 2, 2024.

AB 817 failed a deadline pursuant to Rule 61(b)(13) and is a dead bill.

SB 1209 was signed into law on September 28, 2024. A statement from Senator Dave Cortese on the importance of SB 1209 is provided on the following page.

Senator Dave Cortese issued the following statement regarding the California Senate's approval of his SB 1209:

"Ultimately, SB 1209 is about good governance which aims to protect taxpayers and ratepayers from being saddled with additional, unexpected, and unnecessary fees. It does so by extending the same indemnification provisions afforded to city, county, and special district jurisdictions to Local Agency Formation Commissions (LAFCOs)," said Senator Cortese. "By indemnifying LAFCOs, we prevent the buck from being passed down onto consumers."

"I am pleased and grateful to learn that the Assembly has approved SB 1209 and we are one step close to the bill becoming law. Approval of SB 1209 will provide California LAFCOs with the same indemnification authority currently held by counties, cities, and special districts. This authority is essential to LAFCOs' ability to meet their statutory obligations and make decisions without being hindered by the potential costs of defending lawsuits," said Margie Mohler, CALAFCO Chair and Mayor, Town of Yountville.

For most applications to public agencies, such as those for land-use, private parties indemnify the involved city or county. Similarly, LAFCOs have normally required an indemnification provision in applications and conditions of approval.

However, in 2022, the Second District Court of Appeals determined that LAFCO, despite prevailing in the underlying court case, could not require or rely upon indemnification because it is not expressly authorized in the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Act of 2000.

Without the ability to indemnify, the LAFCO will necessarily have to consider whether to make concessions to the applicant, or to not defend its actions. Applicants are typically public agencies (cities and districts), a small percentage are developers, and an even smaller percentage are a member of the general public.

Dear Governor Newsom,

The Napa Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) respectfully requests your signature on **SB 1209**, which would authorize a Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) to require an applicant to indemnify the LAFCO, its agents, officers, and employees from and against any claim, action, or proceeding that may stem from a LAFCO decision to approve an application.

Specifically, SB 1209 adds new language to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (The Act) that authorizes LAFCOs to enter into indemnification agreements with applicants. Counties and cities are already empowered to enter into, and require, indemnification and routinely do so with respect to discretionary land-use approvals. SB 1209 will provide LAFCOs with a similar authority in this situation.

This bill is in response to a 2022 decision of the Second District Court of Appeals, which found that existing State law does not provide LAFCOs with the explicit authority needed to require indemnification. Absent an indemnification authority - and because LAFCO funding is statutorily required from the county, cities, and special districts within a county - any costs to defend litigation end up being absorbed by a LAFCO's funding agencies. Consequently, SB 1209 will allow LAFCOs to use indemnification agreements which, in turn, will ensure they can meet their statutory obligations and make decisions without being hindered by the potential costs of defending lawsuits.

Thus, for the above reasons, Napa LAFCO respectfully requests that you sign SB 1209.

CHAPTER _____

An act to add Section 56383.5 to the Government Code, relating to local government.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1209, Cortese. Local agency formation commission: indemnification.

Existing law, the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000, provides the exclusive authority and procedure for the initiation, conduct, and completion of changes of organization and reorganization for cities and districts, except as specified. The act continues in existence in each county a local agency formation commission (LAFCO) that consists of members appointed, as specified, and oversees those changes of organization and reorganization. The act authorizes a LAFCO to, among other things, review and approve with or without amendment, wholly, partially, or conditionally, or disapprove proposals for changes of organization or reorganization, as specified.

This bill would authorize a LAFCO to require, as a condition for, among other things, processing a change of organization or reorganization, that the applicant agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the LAFCO, its agents, officers, and employees from and against any claim, action, or proceeding, as specified, to attack, set aside, void, or annul an approval by the LAFCO. The bill would require the LAFCO to promptly notify the applicant of any claim, action, or proceeding to attack, set aside, void, or annul an approval by the LAFCO and require the LAFCO to fully cooperate in the defense. The bill would specify that an applicant who is a party to the agreement is not responsible to defend, indemnify, or hold harmless the LAFCO if the LAFCO fails to notify the applicant or cooperate fully in the defense, and is not required to pay or perform any settlement relating to the agreement, unless the applicant approves the settlement. The bill would specify that nothing in its provisions are to be construed to prohibit the LAFCO from participating in the defense of any claim, action, or proceeding to attack, set aside, void, or annul an approval by the commission if specified conditions are met, including that the

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LAFCO bears its own attorney's fees and costs of the claim, action, or proceeding.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 56383.5 is added to the Government Code, to read:

56383.5. (a) The commission may require, as a condition for processing a change of organization or reorganization, a sphere amendment or a sphere update, or any other action or determination requested from the commission, that the applicant agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the commission, its agents, officers, and employees from any claim, action, or proceeding against the commission, its agents, officers, or employees to attack, set aside, void, or annul an approval by the commission.

(b) (1) An agreement to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless entered into pursuant to subdivision (a) shall require the commission to promptly notify the applicant of any claim, action, or proceeding to attack, set aside, void, or annul an approval by the commission and shall require the commission to cooperate fully in the defense.

(2) An applicant who is a party to an agreement to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless entered into pursuant to subdivision (a) shall not be responsible to defend, indemnify, or hold harmless if the commission fails to notify the applicant or cooperate fully in the defense pursuant to paragraph (1).

(c) An applicant who is a party to an agreement to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless entered into pursuant to subdivision (a) shall not be required to pay or perform any settlement relating to the agreement, unless the applicant approves the settlement.

(d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the commission from participating in the defense of any claim, action, or proceeding to attack, set aside, void or annul an approval by the commission if both of the following conditions are met:

(1) The commission bears its own attorney's fees and costs of the claim, action, or proceeding.

(2) The commission defends the claim, action, or proceeding in good faith.



WHEREAS, an application for a proposed change of organization has been filed with the Local Agency Formation Commission of Napa County, hereinafter referred to as "Commission," pursuant to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000; and

WHEREAS, the proposal seeks Commission approval to annex approximately 1.67 acres of incorporated land to the Napa Sanitation District and represents one entire parcel located at 25 Lynn Drive in the City of Napa and identified by the County of Napa Assessor's Office as Parcel Number (APN) 041-560-001; and

WHEREAS, the Commission's Executive Officer has reviewed the proposal and prepared a report with recommendations; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Officer's report and recommendations have been presented to the Commission in the manner provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the Commission finds that all owners of land affected by the proposal consent to the subject annexation; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with applicable provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (hereinafter "CEQA"), the Commission considered available exemptions under CEQA, in accordance with Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations (hereinafter "CEQA Guidelines"); and

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COMMISSION DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER as follows:

1. The Factors for Commission Determinations provided in the Executive Officer's written report are hereby incorporated herein by this reference and are adequate.

The underlying activity, annexation of the affected territory, is exempt from further review pursuant to California Code of Regulations (CCR) Title 14 section 15061(b)(3), where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that this annexation may have a significant effect on the environment. The proposed annexation is exempt from further review pursuant to CCR Title 14 section 15282(k), which exempts the installation of new pipeline as long as the project does not exceed one mile in length. The proposed annexation is exempt from further review pursuant to CCR Title 14 section 15301, which exempts annexations that will result in negligible or no expansion of the existing private structure and existing public facilities. The proposed annexation is exempt from further review pursuant to CCR Title 14 section 15303, which exempts new construction or conversion of small structures. The proposed annexation is exempt from further review pursuant to CCR Title 14 section 15319(b), which exempts annexations to a city or special district of areas containing existing public or private structures developed to the density allowed by the current zoning or prezoning of either the gaining or losing environmental agency, whichever is more restrictive, provided, however, that the extension of utility services to the existing facilities would have a capacity to serve only the existing facilities. The records upon which these findings are made are located at the Commission's administrative office located at 1754 Second Street, Suite C, Napa, California 94559.

- 2. The proposal is APPROVED subject to completion of item number 11 below.
- 3. This proposal is assigned the following distinctive short-term designation:

LYNN DRIVE ANNEXATION TO THE NAPA SANITATION DISTRICT

- 5. The affected territory is shown on the map and described in the geographic description in the attached Exhibit "A".
- 6. The affected territory so described is uninhabited as defined in California Government Code section 56046.
- 7. The Napa Sanitation District utilizes the regular assessment roll of the County of Napa.
- 8. The affected territory will be taxed for existing general bonded indebtedness of the Napa Sanitation District.
- 9. The proposal shall be subject to the terms and conditions of the Napa Sanitation District.
- 10. The Commission waives conducting authority proceedings in accordance with California Government Code section 56662(a).

- 13. The Commission hereby directs staff to file a Notice of Exemption in compliance with CEQA.







RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended the Commission establish an ad hoc subcommittee with two appointed members to advise staff in completing a review and update of adopted local policies. The ad hoc subcommittee would disband upon completion of the policy review and update.

BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY

In recent months, several Commissioners have expressed interest in revisiting certain adopted local policies for purposes of exploring areas of improvement.

Staff believes there are approximately 10 adopted local policies in need of revisions to address issues that include, but are not limited to, the Commission's budget, outside service agreements, disadvantaged unincorporated communities, and state legislation.

Staff recommends the Commission provide advisory assistance by way of establishing a new ad hoc subcommittee and appointing two members. Alternate Commissioners may be appointed, if interested. The subcommittee would immediately terminate upon completion of the policy review and update process.
